### Fife Rural Development Fund 2026-2027

The Fife Rural Development Fund 2026 - 2027 Community-Led Local Development (CLLD) programme is now open for Expressions of Interest from applicants delivering community-focused revenue projects across rural Fife. There is no further funding available for capital projects in 2026/27.

‘Community-led’ local development gives rural communities in Fife the power and resource to identify and respond to their own, local challenges. By building knowledge and skills, supporting new ideas, offering training opportunities and encouraging co-operation and partnership working, CLLD helps to create viable and resilient communities.

There is £200,000 available to applicants seeking to deliver revenue projects. The fund is governed by the Fife Local Action Group (LAG) who have set the maximum grant amount for revenue funds at £25,000 for projects that meet the priorities set for the area.

### ARTS & CULTURE GRANTS

- **Creative Scotland - Open Fund** - supports organisations who require funding to undertake creative activity. **No Deadlines.** [Click here for more information.](#)

- **Historic Environment Scotland** - can support a wide range of projects which clearly relate to and will benefit Scotland's historic environment, e.g. historic buildings, ancient monuments and archaeology, designed or cultural landscapes and historic gardens and battlefields.
