Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer Report

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to inform members of the Committee of the activities of the Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer from April 2023 – June 2023.

Recommendation(s)

The Committee is asked to note the contents of the report.

Resource Implications

The costs of the officers' activities are met from the existing budget.

Legal & Risk Implications

The activities of the Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer will ensure the Council are seen to be taking appropriate action to ensure those individuals and companies issued with licences by Fife Council are maintaining high standards and complying with the conditions of the licences issued.

Impact Assessment

The activities of the Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer will not impact on any one area of the community more than any other. There is therefore no requirement for an impact assessment.

Consultation

To ensure the activities of the Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer are focussed on areas of particular need, close consultation is held with members of the Civic Government Licensing Team, the Convener and Vice Convener of the Committee, other services within Fife Council and Police Scotland Fife Division. Licence-holders and members of the public are consulted on a needs basis during enquiries into complaints or compliance checks.

1.0 Background

- 1.1 There is one Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer working 8am to 6pm Monday to Thursday, with flexibility for working outwith these hours/days. Currently, the officer is primarily working from home. The objectives of this post are to:
 - Make enquiry into complaints relating to the holders of licences under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982
 - To undertake spot checks to ensure the conditions of licences are complied with
 - To take appropriate enforcement action where conditions of licences are not being complied with
 - To improve standards of licence holders
 - To undertake joint inspections with other agencies or services of Fife Council to determine compliance with licence conditions
 - To take action in relation to unlicensed activities and report where necessary to Police Scotland (Fife Division) for consideration of prosecution

2.0 Enquiry Activity

- 2.1 This report covers the period from 1 April 2023 30 June 2023.
- 2.2 The Enforcement Officer has undertaken 41 enquiries into complaints, suspected non-compliance with licence conditions, requests for assistance with applications and other licensing issues. Some of these complaints have been straightforward and were easily resolved, others however have been more complex and required extended enquiry and input from other services or agencies. These enquiries included the following licensed activities:

•	Market Operator Licence	3
•	Public Entertainment Licence	1
•	Second Hand Dealers	4
•	Skin Piercing & Tattooing	1
•	Street Traders	1
•	Taxi Drivers	24
•	Vehicle Operators	7

2.3 These have resulted in the following outcomes/disposals:

•	Assistance Provided	11
•	Licence Surrendered	1
•	Monitored	1
•	Referred to Other Agencies	1
•	Reported to Committee	1
•	Unfounded	9
•	Verbal Warning	7

- 2.4 16 Spot checks have been conducted by the Enforcement Officer on the following licensed activities:
 - Second Hand DealersStreet TradersTaxi Drivers8

This included a joint inspection of taxis with police officers from the Road Policing team on a Friday night.

- 2.5 These have resulted in the following outcomes/disposals:
 - No Issues 12
 - Non-compliance with conditions of licence 4

2.6 Facebook Update

The Facebook page continues to be a popular means to circulate information relevant to the taxi trade in Fife. Recent posts have included:

- Road Closures and diversions
- Changes to online applications and substitutions
- Information on the annual test schedules
- Note of appreciation to operators on annual test results

2.7 Unmet Demand Monitoring

Regular checks at taxi ranks across Fife and discussion with taxi operators continued during the period covered by this report to assess levels of demand. During the period 12 ranks checks were carried out at various times of the day and night. These observations and consultations show there is no change to the level of demand for taxi services.

There is not therefore considered to be any significant unmet demand for taxi services in Fife. The 2014 Halcrow report on unmet demand remains relevant.

3.0 Conclusions

3.1 The work of the Enforcement Officer continues to focus on areas of particular need through the analysis of complaints and observations in the Licensing Unit and at Regulation and Licensing Committee.

Consultation with other services and joint working is continuing to ensure a coordinated approach to enforcement where that is appropriate.

This appendix gives more detail in relation to some of the outcomes listed in that section.

Advice

Advice was given to:

- A number of Street Traders on the suitability of trading locations
- An ex-operator of a taxi who had not removed the taximeter from his car
- A taxi driver reported for parking inappropriately at the roadside
- Taxi operators regarding the use of an East plated taxi in the Leven area, appropriate signage on taxis and parking licensed vehicles on pavements
- Organisers of events which required licences but hadn't been applied for

Assistance Provided

In order to assist the licensing team dealing with incomplete applications, the Enforcement Officer has made efforts to contact the applicants and obtain the documents/information that is required to progress the application.

Licence Surrendered

A Second Hand car dealer surrendered their licence after contact from the Enforcement Officer revealed they were no longer trading.

Monitor

Monitoring is continuing into the activities of taxi drivers and operators in the East Fife area following complaints of non-compliance with licences.

Other Agency

The police have been notified of a complaint about taxis obstructing traffic that falls within their remit to investigate.

Reported to Committee

One taxi driver has been reported to the Committee for consideration of suspension based on complaints received.

Unfounded

9 complaints were considered unfounded after investigation; these related to a Second Hand car dealer, licensed tattoo artists, a Street Trader, 4 taxi drivers and 2 Vehicle Operators.

Verbal Warning

7 verbal warnings were given for minor indiscretions; these related to a second hand car dealer and 6 taxi drivers.

Appendix 2 Spot Check Outcomes

Section 2.4-2.5 gives quantitative information relating to spot checks conducted by the Enforcement Officer.

This appendix gives detail in relation to some of the outcomes listed in that section.

Checks were made on:

- 3 Second Hand Dealer licence holders
- 5 Street Traders selling food and drinks
- 8 taxi drivers in taxi ranks and mobile

There were no issues in relation to the checks carried out with the second hand dealer and street trader licence holders, and 4 of the taxi drivers as they were found to be complying with the conditions of their licences.

4 taxi drivers were verbally warned for a variety of issues. 2 were found not to be displaying their ID badges while driving the taxis at night (one was sent off the rank to collect it and the other had left it in his other taxi and arranged for another driver to bring it to him). 1 vehicle was not displaying no-smoking signs and was provided with them. 1 vehicle had an engine management light illuminated and was taken off road until it was fixed.
