Section 1: Introduction

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The regeneration proposals for the Victoria Road Corridor of Kirkcaldy have been developed through a charrette programme undertaken with Fife Council, community partners and stakeholders and supported through the Scottish Government Mainstream Charrette Programme.

The charrette programme has allowed Fife Council, community stakeholders and land owners and other interests to be innovative in exploring options and developing proposals that can support regeneration across the inner urban area of the town centred on Victoria Road.

This report forms the third in a series of three documents:

- Part 1: **Consultation Report** setting out a record of the three-day planning charrette and associated consultation involving the local community, Fife Council and other key stakeholders.
- Part 2: Land-Use Regeneration Strategy defining a land-use strategy for inclusion in the emerging Local Development Plan
- Part 3: **Regeneration Action Plan** setting out the actions and a range of initiatives raised through the Regeneration Strategy and Consultation

This report sets out recommended project priorities, timeframes and responsibilities for the advancement of the Land-Use Regeneration Strategy.



Section 2: Kirkcaldy Area Community Plan

2.0 KIRKCALDY AREA COMMUNITY PLAN

Fife Partnership has an approved Fife's Community Plan for the period 2011 - 2020. The Partnership involves the public, voluntary and private sectors and works to support all partners working together in order to strengthen Fife's future and make this a great place to live, work, visit and invest. Fife's Community Plan 2011 – 2020 sets out three high level outcomes that the partnership are working to secure:

Reducing inequalities

- Making Fife's communities safer
- Meeting the need for suitable housing choices
- Reducing low income households
- Increasing the capability of Fifers to take action and make a difference to their communities
- Strengthening communities through regeneration
- Raising educational attainment and reducing educational inequality
- Improving early years development of children in Fife
- Improving the health of Fifers and narrowing the health inequality gap

Increasing employment

- Extending employment and skills opportunities
- More dynamic businesses
- Developing a modern business infrastructure
- Improving the knowledge and research base
- Growing businesses & employment in key sectors (renewables and tourism)

Tackling climate change

- Adapting to climate change
- Reducing carbon emissions (including reducing energy use, more sustainable transport and less waste)

The delivery of Fife's Community Plan and the contribution that the Fife Partnership makes to the delivery of the Scottish Government's National Outcomes are detailed in the Single Outcome Agreement for Fife.

The delivery of the Community Plan and the Single Outcome Agreement is underpinned by: Partnership strategies / Partners' organisational strategies and plans identified with local community planning.



Section 3: Regeneration and Community Planning

3.0 REGENERATION & COMMUNITY PLANNING

Regeneration and Community Planning

Building stronger, more resilient and more empowered and active communities is at the heart of good community planning and regeneration. The charrette programme for Victoria Road Kirkcaldy has had as part of its central objective to encourage, facilitate and support community participation and to build a platform for more empowered and active communities.

Fife Council and the charrette facilitators have worked hard both to engage with a wider audience (local businesses / young people / community leaders) and made use of a mechanism and media variety of media to capture ideas (voxbox / questionnaires / post-its / interviews / group workshops / one-to-one interviews / written submissions / charrette / walk-abouts / photo-records / etc).

Critical to the whole process has been to facilitate opportunity for community voices and to encourage participation not only in the regeneration planning but throughout the delivery of project and programme initiatives.

Regeneration delivers stronger outcomes, in short time frames where it is fully engaged with stakeholders and delivering a range of initiatives that include:

Top Down Initiatives

Initiatives secured by primary agencies in meeting the needs of the local community through mainstream services and delivery programmes (education / health / housing / services to communities / regulatory activity.

Bottom Up Initiatives

Initiatives secured through local action involving public, private or third sectors and direct community and stakeholder action (often complimentary and supported by agencies / mainstream programmes / etc) and led through community interests.

Regeneration works best when it engages widely and delivers activity across a broad spectrum of initiatives and project types. A key part of the regeneration of Victoria Road must be to build a more active base for community action and activism and the Community Planning Partnership should work to support this goal.

Regeneration and Economic Planning

Building stronger and more resilient communities also involves building a stronger economy with enhanced access to employment, good and high value jobs, training and skills development. Increasing wealth, addressing worklessness and barriers to employability, and creating routes to employment for young people are key elements of both Community Planning and the Fife Economic Strategy 2013 – 2023. This includes Fife Council, the Fife Economy Partnership and the Opportunities Fife Partnership (lead partner on delivery of Employability and Skills for Fife).

The Strategy's ten-year vision is for a vibrant local economy in Fife through sustainable economic growth - where Fife's business environment inspires residents and businesses to create private sector job opportunities, making Fife the best place to start and grow a business.




Figure 2: Proposed Land Use Allocation

The economic strategy and community planning have strong cross-cutting themes around the following areas relevant to regeneration in Kirkcaldy:

Place-making

Building successful places that support sustainable economic activity and at the local level support a 'Town Centre First' approach to the Kirkcaldy Town Centre that strengths the demand for goods and services extending a building a well connected, accessible the town centre catchment.

Renewable Energy and Low Carbon Futures




Tourism and Visitor Interest

Building on the rich and varied history of Kirkcaldy and the Forbo-Nairn and linoleum history offers enormous opportunities given the ready connection to the Fife Coastal Path, and proximity to the town centre, Kirkcaldy Museum and legacy of interesting buildings, and local centres.

Successful Regeneration

Strengthening community capacity; building good connections (digital / physical (paths-cycleways-greenspace) heritage / community) and promoting investment offer opportunity to weave within the regeneration strategy both economic and community planning interests. The regeneration strategy for Victoria Road looks to ensure that Victoria Road makes a positive contribution to outcomes under both community and economic planning strategies.


Section 4: Regeneration Action Plan

4.0 REGENERATION ACTION PLAN

The Action Plan for the Victoria Road Regeneration sits within the Community Planning Framework and captures a breadth of project initiatives and opportunities identified within the charrette and wider consultations that can support regeneration

The Action Plan is a framework. The identified projects are not exhaustive and are intended to highlight areas of opportunity. It is not the intent that all projects are advanced. The Action Plan is a call for action. The Plan looks to capture the ideas presented and provide a simple tabulated framework around which stakeholders and community groups can look to secure support and select initiatives and projects for delivery.

Regeneration needs an active community. Growing the community (facilitating housing investment / securing investment / expanding businesses) will involve initiatives led through public and private sector partners. Community activism working through groups like Greener Kirkcaldy and civic and heritage groups should be actively promoted.
