# Play Practice Development Team

The Play Practice Development Team is based within the Early Years Team, Education and Children's Services Directorate. Established in 2012, our primary focus is to support play development across Fife to improve children's outcomes through play. This recognises the role play has in child development and in the development of physical and mental health and wellbeing.

Scotland's National Play Strategy (2013) acknowledges that children's play is crucial to Scotland's wellbeing and that play is an essential part of a happy, healthy childhood and fundamental to children and young people's quality of life.

Contributing to this by supporting play development across Fife, we promote and develop play opportunities based on Playwork practice that is focussed on free play, outdoor play, and the play process, underpinned by the Playwork Principles and the child's right to play, enshrined in the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child.

The COVID-19 Pandemic has highlighted the importance of play, and specifically outdoor play for children's health and wellbeing.

# Play Practice Development Team Workstream Overview

#### Free Range Project

The Free Range Project is a targeted, referral based outdoor play project based at Falkland Estate. The aim of the project is to improve children's quality of life through outdoor play. It is an entirely outdoor free play experience for children aged 4-10 years and aims to increase children's confidence and resilience by providing challenge and adventurous play for vulnerable children from identified areas of Fife during school holiday periods. Over 1500 children have attended the project since 2012.

## Workstream Overview

#### Play in the Community

Play Ranger Sessions can take place in a local park or greenspace, or school and are free play sessions for children of all ages and their families. This supports communities' understanding of the importance of play for children's wellbeing and supporting family bonds.

Outdoor adventure days/weeks is a community based play programme that takes place in local parks, woodland, and beaches across Fife during school holidays for children aged 4-12 years. Parent/carers can book children on for a required number of days at a cost.

#### Play Training & Development Support

The Play Practice Development Team offer training and play development support to nurseries, schools, out of school clubs and community groups and the wider play sector to enrich learning experiences, support creativity and active learning based on free play and outdoor play. Examples of training courses; Nature Kindergarten, Inspiring Outdoor Play, and Loose Parts Play and Fire Training. Play development support is available on request.

### Referrer feedback

He was so excited to share his experiences at Free Range with his classmates and his teacher. He was then able to get himself back into the right frame to re-join the class and continue with his day."
