White Meter 1	Single meter	2	Day/Night	There are two different rates – day and night. Your night-time rate will be cheaper because it is out with peak hours and your daytime will be more expensive because it is in peak time. If you have storage heaters, using the night-time rate to store up heat will be cheaper.
Economy 7	Single meter	2	Day/Night	Economy 7 gives you 7 hours of cheap electricity. Fife is area 18 (South Scotland) which means the off-peak times are 23:00 - 07:30.
Economy 10	Single meter	2 Labelled 'low' and 'normal'	Day/Night	Economy 10 is designed to work for electric wet heating systems rather than storage heaters. You get 10 hours of cheaper electricity split throughout the day across 3 periods. There is an early morning off-peak time period which is usually 4.30am-7.30am, an afternoon 1pm-4pm and evening 8.30pm-12.30am. These times can change depending on the supplier and the time of year. Using electricity at these times will be cheaper than the peak times in between.
Comfort Plus White Meter	Single meter	3	Day/Night/Control	Comfort Plus Meters have a day rate (peak) 08.00-23.30 and night rate (off-peak) 23.30-08.00 but also have a control rate which makes up the 3 'registers'. Control rate is for storage heating is energised for 8.5hrs in every 24hr period. This allows you to store up heat over night on a cheap rate and let it out during the day when you require it. There is also a WeatherCall version where the time periods are determined by the forecast.

Comfortplus Control	2 x Single meter	2	Domestic / Control	Normal domestic appliance usage will be recorded on the Domestic meter. Heating and hot water usage will be recorded on the Control rate meter. Storage heating should form 60% of the total installed heating load. The charge provided by ScottishPower depends on the forecast temperature as Weathercall is an integral part of the tariff. The actual charge period is therefore weather dependant as described above.
Economy 2000	Single meter	3	Domestic / Economy 2000	<p>This tariff is intended for medium capacity storage boilers providing space heating or both space and water heating. Electricity for all other purposes must be taken on Domestic Tariff.</p> <p>The Economy 2000 supply is made available for periods at ScottishPower's discretion totalling 18 hours per day, but with the proviso that no interruption will exceed 2 hours. Typical off times are 08.00-10.00, 16.30-18.30 & 00.00-02.00. It is important, therefore, that the boiler has a sufficient thermal store to supply space (and possibly water) heating requirements for 2 hours.</p> <p>Direct acting boilers without storage capacity are not permitted to make use of Economy 2000.</p> <p>Rate 1 records daytime domestic use, Rate 2 records nighttime domestic use and Rate 3 is Economy 2000 and records boiler usage only.</p> <p>Some installations may have 2 X single rate meters i.e. 1 for domestic and 1 for Economy 2000.</p>
Off Peak C	Single meter	1	Off Peak C	<p>This tariff was originally designed for older heating systems e.g. storage or underfloor, where longer hours of availability were needed.</p> <p>This tariff gives 12hr availability Mon-Fri and 24hr availability Sat/Sun. Times are at ScottishPower's discretion. Current times are 11.00-1300, 15.00-16.00 & 22.30-07.30 GMT.</p> <p>Electricity for all other purposes must be taken on Domestic tariff.</p>
