Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer Report

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to inform members of the Committee of the activities of the Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer from February – May 2021.

Recommendation(s)

The Committee is asked to note the contents of the report.

Resource Implications

The costs of the officer's activities are met from the existing budget.

Legal & Risk Implications

The activities of the Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer will ensure the Council are seen to be taking appropriate action to ensure those individuals and companies issued with licences by Fife Council are maintaining high standards and complying with the conditions of the licences issued.

Impact Assessment

The activities of the Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer will not impact on any one area of the community more than any other. There is therefore no requirement for an impact assessment.

Consultation

To ensure the activities of the Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer are focussed on areas of particular need close consultation is held with members of the Civic Government Licensing Team, the Convener and Vice Convener of the Committee, other services within Fife Council and Police Scotland Fife Division. Licence-holders and members of the public are consulted on a needs basis during enquiries into complaints or compliance checks.

1.0 Background

- 1.1 There is 1 Civic Government Licensing Enforcement Officer working 9am to 5pm Monday to Thursday, with flexibility for working outwith these hours/days. The objectives of this post are to:
 - Make enquiry into complaints relating to the holders of licences under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982
 - To undertake spot checks to ensure the conditions of licences are complied with
 - To take appropriate enforcement action where conditions of licences are not being complied with
 - To improve standards of licence holders
 - To undertake joint inspections with other agencies or services of Fife Council to determine compliance with licence conditions
 - To take action in relation to unlicensed activities and report where necessary to Police Scotland (Fife Division) for consideration of prosecution

2.0 Enquiry Activity

- 2.1 This report covers the period from 1 February 31 May 2021. The activities of the Enforcement Officer have obviously been curtailed and constrained by the varying levels of the national Covid-19 restrictions and the existing instruction to work from home.
- 2.2 The Enforcement Officer has undertaken 22 enquiries into complaints, suspected non-compliance with licence conditions and other licensing issues. Some of these complaints have been straightforward and were easily resolved, others however have been more complex and required extended enquiry and input from other services or agencies. These enquiries covered the following licensed activities:

- 2.6 A Joint inspection of Street Traders was conducted with Environmental Health at two locations in Fife; Mugdrum car park, Newburgh and Fife Leisure Park, Dunfermline. A number of food stalls were inspected with the following results.

2.7 Facebook Update

The Facebook page continues to be a popular means to circulate information relevant to the taxi trade in Fife. Recent posts have included:

- Road Closures and diversions
- Details about the Covid-19 restrictions
- Information on grants available to taxi drivers

2.8 Unmet Demand Monitoring

While the usual regular checks at taxi ranks across Fife were not possible, discussion with taxi operators continued during the period covered by this report to assess levels of demand. These consultations show there is no change to the level of demand for taxi services. Rank checks have now resumed and will be reported on in due course.

There is not therefore considered to be any significant unmet demand for taxi services in Fife. The 2014 Halcrow report on unmet demand remains relevant.

3.0 Conclusions

3.1 The work of the Enforcement Officer continues to focus on areas of particular need through the analysis of complaints and observations in the Licensing Unit and at Regulation and Licensing Committee.

Consultation with other services and joint working is continuing to ensure a coordinated approach to enforcement where that is appropriate.

Monitoring is continuing into the activities of a second hand car dealer, a street trader and taxi operators regarding potential breaches of conditions.

A tattooist was referred to Police Scotland for enquiry after a report of illegal tattooing within his home address.

Unfounded

4 complaints were considered unfounded after investigation; these related to a Taxi Operator, a Street Trader, a Metal Dealer and a Second Hand Dealer

Warning

4 verbal warnings were given for minor indiscretions; these related to 2 taxi drivers and 2 street traders

Checks were made on:

- a Late Hours Catering licence holder
- 3 Street Traders selling food and drinks

There were no issues in relation to the checks carried out with all licence holders complying with the conditions of their licences.

Section 2.6 gives quantitative information relating to spot checks conducted by the Enforcement Officer and Environmental Health.

This appendix gives detail in relation to some of the outcomes listed in that section.

Checks were made on:

- a Street Trader at Mugdrum car park, Newburgh following noise complaints in the area. Advice was given with regard to measures to take to improve his trading.
- 8 Street Traders selling food and drinks at a market in Dunfermline. The market organiser was advised and assisted in applying for a Market Operator licence. Advice was given to traders without Fife Street Trader licences and on a minor adjustment to a working vehicle.
