Improving the learning environment is one of the key priorities for the Education & Children's Services Directorate and the status of Inverkeithing High School, and the challenges that this presents, creates concern for Officers.

Our ambition is to create a school that is fit for purpose, with suitable and efficient learning environments for children, young people and other learners now and in the future.





Background

- Statutory duty to provide adequate and efficient provision of education.
- Statutory duty of 'Best Value in Public Services'.
- Economic climate means there are not enough resources to do everything, but the current position is unsustainable.
- Inverkeithing High School is the last remaining secondary school in the Dunfermline and South & West Fife areas to be replaced with a new building. Queen Anne High School was replaced in August 2003 and Dunfermline High School was replaced in August 2012. Woodmill High School and St Columba's RC High School will relocate to a new learning campus in August 2024.
- The proposed new secondary school to replace the existing Inverkeithing High School, which has significant accessibility, condition and suitability issues, will provide modern, inspiring and flexible learning spaces to allow young people to experience a wide-ranging curriculum offer.





Inverkeithing High School Information

- School Roll: was 1560 pupils at September 2022 census (97% occupied)
- The planning capacity of the school is currently published at: 1605 pupils
 (Maximum capacity of the school is 1735 this was reduced to allow an amount of decant accommodation should repairs be required)
- Core Facts:

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Accessibility – "D" rated (building is inaccessible)

Condition – "C" rated (poor)

Suitability – "C" rated (poor)
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- Existing building does not meet our aims in terms of accessibility, in all forms, for all pupils, nor for condition and suitability.
- School is located on different levels pupils and staff have to exit and enter at different levels of the site
- Sports facilities are located in the Community Wing





Inverkeithing High School Proposal

- A new school would:
 - be fully accessible for all building users
 - be flexible in terms of delivery of the curriculum
 - support curriculum for excellence
 - be of sufficient size to support house building in the area
 - support continued community use activities
- Construction period of approximately 3 years from completion of the design and following approval of any planning process
- As a result of the identification of the preferred site, no decant would be required






Inverkeithing High School Proposal

- Proposed relocation of Inverkeithing High School, from existing site at Hillend Road, to a new site, south of the A985 (Admiralty Road), to The Fleet Grounds, Rosyth
- No proposed changes to the Inverkeithing High School catchment area or changes to the primary schools associated with Inverkeithing High School
- Due to the geographical location of the proposed site, the name of the school may be changed – this would be a separate consultation with the community
- Site selection was agreed by Committee on 3 November 2020 following feasibility studies on 7 sites, to detailed feasibility on 4 sites.
- No changes to the existing links to Fife College in the delivery of senior phase subjects – Fife College Partnerships to continue
- Funding support through Scottish Government Revenue model




Proposed Site Plan

Site is north of Forbes Road and to the left of Wilson Way






Existing Site of Inverkeithing High School






Associated Primary Schools of Inverkeithing High School, with Proposed Site

Educational Benefits

- The replacement school would ensure all facilities and learning spaces, both inside and out, are fully accessible to all young people and staff.
- Modern, fit for purpose accommodation tailored to meet the educational needs of all the communities in this area would create an inspiring and innovative learning environment that supports the delivery of Curriculum of Excellence.
- Different sizes of learning spaces would allow flexibility to support the delivery of small group work with partners, traditional classroom teaching, interdisciplinary learning across different subject areas, as well as large spaces in dining and assembly to allow performances and larger gatherings.
- The location and specification of both indoor and outdoor learning spaces for young people with additional support needs would ensure the accommodation is accessible and inclusive.
- The new learning facility would be digitally enabled, taking account of the latest technology and the move towards 1:1 devices.
- There would be enhanced sports facilities, both indoors and outdoors, including a fitness suite.
- Space inside and outside would provide opportunities for young people to socialise with peers to support their wellbeing.





School Consultation Process

- Statutory consultation in accordance with the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland)
 Act 2010
- Council required to consult for a minimum of 30 school days
- Statutory consultation period Tuesday 18 April to Friday 2 June 2023, a total of 32 school days
- Pupil consultation pupils from associated schools (P4-P7) and High School pupils
- Education Scotland involvement
- Consultation Report published middle August 2023
- Decision by Fife Council's Cabinet Committee in September 2023
