# 127. CHILDREN'S SERVICES INSPECTION

Councillor Ryan Smart joined the meeting during discussion of the following item.

The Committee considered a report by the Executive Director, Education and Children's Services informing of a recent inspection of Children's Services in Fife by the Care Inspectorate, advising of the outcomes from the inspection and setting out proposals for further improvement.

# **Decision**

The Committee:-

- (1) noted the outcome of the inspection and the range of good practice identified by the Care inspectorate;
- (2) noted that further work was required across children's service partners to address areas for further improvement; and
- (3) agreed that a report on progress in relation the areas identified by the Care Inspectorate for further improvement be submitted to the Committee in twelve months.

#### 128. BUILDING FIFE'S FUTURE

Prior to consideration of the following item, the Convener referred to Colin McCredie's forthcoming retirement from the Council. Members joined with the Convener in expressing their appreciation to Colin for his work with the Council and wished him well for the future.

The Committee considered a report by the Executive Director, Education and Children's Services, providing an update on progress towards the assessment of potential sites for a replacement Inverkeithing High School, in accordance with the Education Authority requirements.

An update was given by the Head of Education Service, the Senior Manager, Building Services and Programme Manager, Building Fife's Future recommending that, following the completion of the phase 1 assessment exercise, the Inverkeithing South site No. 18 at Caldwell Mill/Balast Park be removed from the list of sites to be considered for phase 2 assessment, due to the challenges associated with addressing flood prevention and mitigation, potential contamination and other challenges associated with the development of these sites for a school. Questions were asked by members and answered by officers.

# **Decision**

The Committee:-

- (1) noted the completion of the phase 1 site assessment exercise, in line with the education criteria previously set by the Executive Committee;
- (2) agreed that the Inverkeithing South site 18 at Caldwell Mill/Ballast Park be removed from the list of sites for assessment at the phase 2 stage, due to the challenges associated with addressing flood prevention and mitigation, potential contamination and other challenges associated with the development of these sites for a school; and
- (3) agreed that six sites required further consideration and authorised the preparation of phase 2 feasibility studies to be reported to Committee in August on the remaining six sites as follows:-

Inverkeithing North -

- Site 3 Inverkeithing High School
- Site 4 North of the A921 West
- Site 22 North of A921 East

#### Rosyth -

- Site 10 Fleet Grounds
- Site 11 HMS Caledonia
- Site 12 West Rosyth

#### 129. COST OF SCHOOL DAY UPDATE
