

1 Garden Design Concept

The design concept is based on the seed pod and the organic and natural geometry found around us.

This geometry is connected and forms relationships with other elements to create a complete, balanced and harmonious design.

Within the design there is a reference and purpose for this garden creation. To acknowledge the pain, loss and suffering associated with the Baby Ashes and to provide a place of peace and rest that will bring some comfort.

The geometry and forms will be soft and natural, flowing and swaying, as if like music creates tension and release.

The concept design is intended to be stretched into any location, with the design philosophy being a constant. (See Appendix A)



2 Garden Form

The key design element is to create and deliver quiet sensitive spaces where personal places can be found. There is a hierarchy of space, a series of entrance plazas that lead to a central area.

These areas will show smooth stone boulder seating set so individual quiet areas can be found, memorialisation can be through a large specimen tree, railing with padlocks or a sculpture element. The sculpture element can be set at the entrance spaces. This will require sensitive consultation.

The spaces are flanked by swathes of ground cover planting with spring bulbs, each space can reflect a season. Beyond the planting are shaped and sculpted mounds to remove the need for expensive walls, allowing all resources to be responsibly spent on materials that best serve the function of the garden.(See Appendix B)



3 Artist & Art Work

We have worked with Lorena Weepers a Duncan of Jordanson College of Art Honours degree student in Art & Design. Our commission with the University of Dundee, was to prepare the working drawings to implement Lorena's design. Lorena's project was entiltled 'Good Grief'. The project explored the nature of grief:

Good Grief encourages people to acknowledge grief by providing them with a way to visualise it.

This is done through ritual and memorialisation, both of which pause to acknowledge feelings outside of your normal routine. I have designed a ritual based around an interactive memorial, the narrative of which lets the user engage with their grief mentally and physically, allowing them to feel safe to express their emotions. Based in the Dundee University Botanical Gardens, the memorial consists of stones made of cast glass, acting as a metaphor for the link between life and death becoming less of a divide and more a bond that needs to be continued. The permanence of the stones is juxtaposed with the papers that people write their expressions of grief on, symbolising the transience of life we experience when losing someone whilst maintaining emotion within the stones as we do with memories of those we have lost. (Appendix C)

TLC Environmental and Lorena Weepers in conjunction have formed a good working relationship, both in a closer undersatnding of grief and the practicalities of delivering a sculpture element and the team required to deliver.



4 Cost Plan

An Implementation programme at this stage is not possible until all the design elements have been agreed and costed.



7 Construction

A time frame cannot be determined until all design elements are agreed and costed.



Good Grief Garden

Good Grief







Good Grief encourages people to acknowledge grief by providing them with a way to visualise it. This is done through ritual and memorialisation, both of which pause to acknowledge feelings outside of your normal routine. I have designed a ritual based around an interactive memorial, the narrative of which lets the user engage with their grief mentally and physically, allowing them to feel safe to express their emotions. Based in the Dundee University Botanical Gardens, the memorial consists of stones made of cast glass, acting as a metaphor for the link between life and death becoming less of a divide and more a bond that needs to be continued. The permanence of the stones is juxtaposed with the papers that people write their expressions of grief on, symbolising the transience of life we experience when losing someone whilst maintaining emotion within the stones as we do with memories of those we have lost.

Coming off the garden path in the north east corner of the Botanical gardens, four private spaces nestle into the site, each defined by a border of cast glass stones, welcoming you into the installation to discover a tranquil writing area within. People express their thoughts of their loved ones on the paper provided in the privacy of the writing space. Rolling the piece of paper once they have finished writing, they choose a stone to place their note into, before depositing it through the hole in the centre. In response, the chosen stone with the note deposited within will then light up, diffusing light throughout its cast glass facades, symbolising the user has charged the stone with emotion and can acknowledge that they are part of a larger community as they see their note fall amongst the others within the stone.





































EXPLODED VIEW RIGHT ELEVATION 1:20




LORENA WEEPERS	EXPLODED VIEW







PROJECTED VIEW 1:10




