ARTS & CULTURE GRANTS

- Hugo Burge Foundation Creative Communities fund will go towards supporting
 organisations, festivals, fairs and community groups that develop and deliver
 initiatives focusing on culture and creative arts in their local area. Creative Education
 fund is seeking applications from people, schools, and arts and culture organisations
 that are creating opportunities for young people (0-29) to engage and build their
 creative skills and knowledge. Deadline: 30th September 2025. Click here for more

- Music For All grants are available to address the musical needs of community music
 groups and educational organisations. This fund will support projects and initiatives
 taking place throughout the UK that all aim to bring music to their community and
 would benefit from a "helping hand" to fulfil their potential in becoming truly
 sustainable music programmes. Next Deadline: 24th September 2025. Click here for

- National Lottery Heritage Grants fund projects that connect people and communities to the national, regional and local heritage of the UK. They fund projects that value, care for and sustain heritage for everyone across the UK, now and in the future. Heritage can include nature and habitats, historic buildings and environments, or cultures, traditions and people's memories. There are two grant levels available, £10k £250k and £250k £10m. - National Museums of Scotland The fund helps museums, galleries, libraries and
 archives throughout Scotland to make acquisitions for their collections, provided
 they are open to the public and not run for profit. Grants may be made to assist the
 purchase of an object or group of objects that conforms to the applicant's collecting

- **Scops Arts Trust** aims to give people of all ages, backgrounds and life circumstances, opportunities to access, participate in and enjoy the arts, particularly the performing arts. **Next Deadline: 23rd September 2025**. <u>Click here for more information</u>.

COMMUNITIES

- Carnegie Trust grants are given for projects and activities with social, community, educational, cultural, sporting and recreational purposes which benefit people in the local area. Applications can be made at any time <u>Click here for more information</u>
- Crowdfund Fife provides an opportunity for local, constituted community groups to crowdfund and receive a matching grant from Fife Council. Projects that can be funded include: small capital works to improve your community, local events that bring people out of their homes e.g. Men's Shed, Tea Dance etc, regeneration of your local area, pilot projects that trial alternative ways of working, buying new equipment, materials, or expertise you do not already have that will expand your activities and encourage more people to get involved in your group, a technical study if you are developing a new facility or service. - Crown Estate provides funding (grants of up to £40,000) if you have a project which
 focusses on community priorities, the themes of the Climate Fife Strategy & Action
 Plan. Deadline: 30th September 2025. Email: Community.Investment@fife.gov.uk

- Edinburgh Airport Fund provides financial support to community groups and charities that are committed to improving the opportunities, facilities and services available to local people. Next Deadline: 28th November 2025. Click here for more information
- **Fife Charities Trust** is Fife Council's employee charity group and operate a grants scheme on behalf of the Fife Lottery Organisation. This raises funds for charitable and community groups through the Fife Council Employee Lottery for various type of projects. Charity and Community Groups seeking funding MUST be nominated by a Fife Council Employee. Applications are considered throughout the year. Click here for more information
- FCC Scottish Action Fund offers funding to projects through the Scottish Landfill Communities Fund. It awards grant for community, environmental and heritage projects. Next Deadline: 5pm, 19th November 2025. <u>Click here for more information</u>
- **Fife Environment Trust** offers funding to projects through the Scottish Landfill Communities Fund. It awards grant for community, environmental and heritage projects. There are two levels of funding. Small grant scheme up to £10,000 and Large grant scheme £10,000 to £50,000. Click here for more information

COST OF LIVING

 Aberlour Urgent Assistance Fund - can provide immediate relief to families with children (aged 21 and under) who are suffering extreme hardship. Families who are struggling to provide food, heating and clothing for their children. This support is usually via cash grants to assist with a range of needs, such as food, utilities, clothing,

- bedding, appliance repairs, replacement of appliances that have failed, or other essentials. **Applications can be made at any time** <u>Click here for more information</u>
- BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme supports children and young people who are facing exceptionally difficult circumstances. The programme provides items that meet a child's most basic needs such as a bed to sleep in, a cooker to provide a hot meal and other items or services critical to a child's wellbeing.

- Sainsburys Local Food Donation Programme will donate food free of charge which may include fresh food (within their use by date), that is fit for human consumption to charity. systems. There is no specific deadline for this one but funds must be drawn down

- Esmee Fairbairn Foundation is one of the largest independent grant-makers in the UK. This could include creating or improving community gardens, shared spaces, wildflower meadows, ponds, woodlands and other wildlife habitats. Grants between £50 £250 are available. - Big Issue Invest is a venture established to provide social investment and loan finance to social enterprises, social ventures and third sector organisations in Scotland. Like The Big Issue, BIIS aims to help people to help themselves by investing in social enterprises that have business-like responses to social problems.

- **Firstport Build It** aims to help early-stage social enterprises working towards becoming financially sustainable. It offers grant funding for salary costs so that the new jobs help the enterprise increase its income, become financially sustainable and continue to deliver social impact without relying on grant funding. **Next Deadline: 25th September 2025**. - UnLtd Awards The programme provides specialist support for social entrepreneurs
 to help them grow as social leaders. They combine cash and coaching to help nurture
