ARTS & CULTURE GRANTS

- **Creative Scotland - Open Fund** - supports organisations who require funding to undertake creative activity. **No Deadlines.** [Click here for more information.](#)
- **Historic Environment Scotland** - can support a wide range of projects which clearly relate to and will benefit Scotland's historic environment, e.g. historic buildings, ancient monuments and archaeology, designed or cultural landscapes and historic gardens and battlefields. **Deadlines throughout the year.** [Click here for more information](#)
- **National Lottery Heritage Grants** - fund projects that connect people and communities to the national, regional and local heritage of the UK. They fund projects that value, care for and sustain heritage for everyone across the UK, now and in the future. Heritage can include nature and habitats, historic buildings and environments, or cultures, traditions and people's memories. There are two grant levels available, £10k - £250k and £250k - £10m. **Applications can be made at any time** [Click here for more information](#)
- **National Museums of Scotland** - The fund helps museums, galleries, libraries and archives throughout Scotland to make acquisitions for their collections, provided they are open to the public and not run for profit. Grants may be made to assist the

purchase of an object or group of objects that conforms to the applicant's collecting policy. **Applications can be made at any time** [Click here for more information](#)

- **The Association for Industrial Archaeology - Restoration Grant** - Grants are provided for the restoration of historically, technically, architecturally, and/or archaeologically important industrial buildings, structures, machinery, vehicles and vessels within the UK. **Next Deadline: 31st March 2027.** [Click here for more information.](#)

This Editions Top Tip

Applying for a community grant? Here are two quick tips to help your application shine:

 **DO** - Make your budget add up: ensure all costs are clearly itemised, realistic and consistent with the activities and expenditure outlined in your application. Include supporting quotations.

 **DON'T** - Ignore the Future - Plan for sustainability - failing to explain how your project or organisation will continue after the grant funding ends can be a significant concern for funders. Clearly outline your plans for the future and how project costs will be met long term.
